Community Pride!

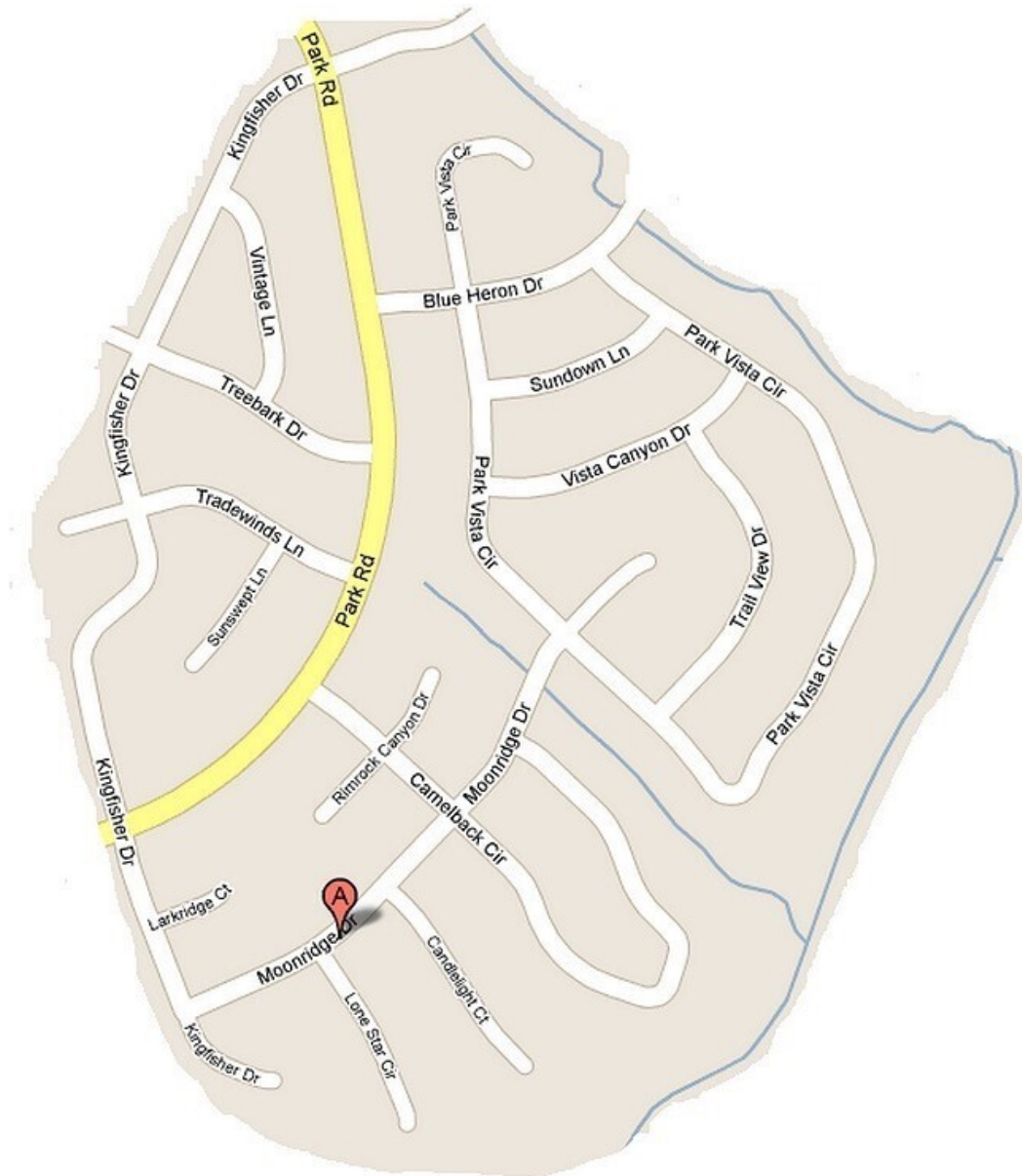

Neighborhood Map

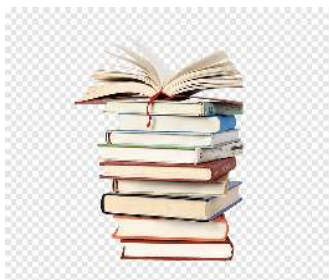

McMullen Creek Greenway



This horseshoe shaped greenway runs 5.8 miles through south Charlotte and passes under Interstate 485. The [trail](#) is composed of a variety of surface types including asphalt, gravel, and boardwalk. There is an entrance from our neighborhood- the sidewalks from along Blue Heron Drive and down Castlekeep Road will lead you right from our community to the Greenway. The trail head is also accessible from Pineville-Matthews Road/Highway 51. It's a great place to walk the dog or just enjoy the day!

Working With CMPD and CFD



PRHA works closely with law enforcement with our [CrimeWatch](#) program. In order to have a safe neighborhood, you should know who your neighbors are on either side of your home, and directly across the street from you. We can all do our part in keeping an eye out for suspicious activity by calling 911 when you see something. Park Ridge and CMPD work as a team, maintaining a safe environment for our residents and families!

What's Going On?!



Some of you may have noticed this! This temporary bridge structure has been erected as part of a bypass pumping system. It is set to be in place through May, awaiting additional materials. Once all equipment has been installed it is to be disassembled, according to [Charlotte Water](#):

January through February 2022 – crews will deliver heavy equipment, inspect the wastewater pipe, and install temporary above-ground pipes, including bridge crossings at Carolina Place Parkway and Park Road.

February - Spring 2022 – crews will install the new interior lining.

Summer 2022 – crews will complete work and restore the area.

Code Enforcement



The [City of Charlotte Housing Code](#) requires homeowners and landlords to maintain their homes/properties to a minimum standard. We can take pride in our neighborhood by maintaining our homes, not parking on our lawns, and keeping sidewalks and drains in front of our homes clear of trash and debris. If you see a violation, maybe inform or even assist your neighbor first, whenever possible. But if you see a repeated violation, you may report it by calling Charlotte 311, or by downloading the [CLT+](#) app! You can check on active cases [here](#).

HOW TO AVOID FINES?

- **Do not park on the front lawn. You may receive a \$25 fine.**
- **Rollout containers should be removed by midnight on the day of collection.**
- **Yard waste should be collected and placed in compostable paper bags or a reusable container.**
- **Schedule bulky items with 311.**

CLT+ App

CLT+ is the new City of Charlotte service request and information app. It's available on the Apple Store and Google Play store, and it is free to download! You can schedule a bulky trash pickup and many more city services with it. You can also report a pothole, check your trash and recycling pickup day, request a new traffic signal, or report graffiti or a code violation all from the same place! CLT+ is a new way to interact with CharMeck 311, which serves as the customer contact center providing information and services for customers in the City of Charlotte and Mecklenburg County. Residents wishing to get in touch with 311 can still speak with a representative on the phone, request a service online or use the online chat function.

FAQ

1. My dues were paid prior to March of this year, when are they due again? Our fiscal year runs March to March and If you have not paid after March 1, then they are due. There is no cut-off time for paying association dues, but they are due beginning March 1st. So regardless of when you pay during the fiscal year, the strength of the association has been supporting you all year long!

2. Are non-members of the HOA eligible for being awarded Yard of the Month? Most certainly, all residents are considered whether they are members or non-members. In most cases many of the homes that have been chosen have ended up joining the HOA!

3. What is the city ordinance on commercial vehicles being parked in residential street/driveway? Medium size commercial vehicles have to be parked in the driveway and large commercial vehicles are prohibited to be parked overnight in residential areas. Large commercial vehicles are 13,000 lbs., the bed 14 ft length and/or 9 ft high.

4. I was told it was a city code violation to have my house number painted on the curb in front of my home? Charlotte Dept of Transportation (CDOT) Public Service Division confirms it is now permissible to have your house number painted on the city curb in the right of way.

5. Why should I join PRHA? We should [join](#) in order to keep informed about what is happening around us, to add strength to an organization that can help protect its members in the event of fire or missing child and to have a community voice when interacting with local government agencies.

6. Why have we not gone paperless yet? Going paperless will require having most everyone's email address that has one. [Email](#) is the preferred way of communication, currently we have less than 20% of the residents in our neighborhood. Email addresses will always be kept private.

6. Where do I report streetlights out in our neighborhood? You can download the [CLT+](#) app! There's a lot you can do with it. Check it out!

7. Is PRHA in charge of Code Enforcement? Not at all, The City of Charlotte has a division dedicated for this purpose. Code enforcement is the responsibility of each resident, not the city, nor PRHA. See our Code Enforcement page for info on how to check on [active cases](#) or reporting a violation.

8. Where does my dues money go? Dues pay for a number of expenses such as rental fees for our General Membership meetings, newsletter printing, meeting signs, annual picnic, and materials for example.

9. How do I get on the PRHA board? PRHA will announce the areas and positions that are needed at the general meetings. Serving on a [committee](#), being a block captain, and volunteering for various activities to include distribution of door hangers are all a part of the functions board members participate in. Volunteering for any of those is a good way to get started in supporting our association.
